What Your Dog's Nose Reveals About Their Health











What's the wet-nose myth?

A popular myth perpetuated among dog owners is that dog noses must be cold and wet to be healthy. However, this myth can be traced back to the deadly virus canine distemper, which was once common among dogs before the development of vaccinations. A common symptom associated with canine distemper is the thickening of a dog's nose, resulting in a dry or cracked nose. It is likely that people therefore considered a wet, cold nose to be an indicator that a dog was free of the disease.

Why do dogs have wet noses?

Dog noses can be wet for a few reasons. Dog noses, not dissimilar to our own, secrete mucus. While this doesn't typically result in humans having wet noses, it does result in wet dog noses. The interior of a dog's nose has glands to produce mucus and keep nasal passages damp. This layer of mucus can assist your dog's sense of smell.

Dogs are also known to lick their noses. Oftentimes, this is to keep their noses clean. As many dog owners can attest, dogs are known for sticking their snouts just about anywhere. The quickest, easiest way for them to clean up is usually to lick off any debris. A side effect of licking this dirt off the nose is that some of those scent particles end up in the dog's mouth, which strengthens their sense of smell.

Having a wet nose makes smelling easier. Because dogs rely on their sense of smell more than humans do, keeping their nose wet is usually important to them.

Can a dog's nose be too wet?

Yes! Even though many people think that a wet dog nose is a sign of excellent health, if your dog's nose it too wet it can be a red flag. While some clear discharge from the nose is normal, overproduction of mucus or a change in the color or viscosity of the mucus could indicate that your dog may have a respiratory infection or foreign objects lodged in the nasal passage. If you notice these sorts of changes, please bring your dog to the vet for immediate care.


What does a dry nose mean?

A common misconception is that when a dog has a warm or dry nose, it means they are sick or unhealthy. This is not always the case. It is possible for dogs to have naturally dryer noses. So, trusting the wetness of a dog's nose is not a reliable way to monitor if your dog is sick.

Healthy dogs can have dry noses and sometimes it is situational. For example, if your dog is just waking up from a nap, recently participated in some form of exercise, or is an older dog that has been exposed to the elements over the course of their life, their nose may be dry. This is not a reason to panic!

However, if for some reason you notice a dry nose along with other abnormalities, such as loss of appetite, we recommend taking them for a visit to the vet. Other signs to look out for include redness, cracking, and the development of sores. In these cases, be sure to consult with your vet.

How can I care for my dog's nose in the winter?




Have you ever noticed your nose can get a little dry in the winter? This can happen to your dog, too. When the weather turns icy cold, you might notice that your dog's nose can turn a slightly lighter color. This is typically referred to as a "weathered nose." In addition to lightening in color, their nose could also appear dry or even cracked.

If this happens, we recommend applying a small amount of salve to your dog's nose. We like to use coconut oil or Vaseline.
